This is most certainly one of IJK's poorest releases, it was written by Pete Beckett who has also wrote 'Word Search' for CDS. The game doesn't come with full instructions, the map can be obtained and removed by pressing 'M' but that isn't mentioned !

I started off with sound effects that sounded like a constipated wasp, and line graphics. Whilst loading there had been a fairly decent loading screen. The idea is to use your three bombs to destroy three dams without crashing into the ground, mountains, being shot down, losing fuel, etc. The plane dials for speed, height, fuel, etc. are quite well presented but that's the only decent part of the whole game (aprt from from a jingly tune if you blow up a dam, also heard on 'Flight').

The key response is extremely poor and I was hammering away at the space-bar trying to drop a bomb when it worked and two fell due to the constant pressing so I couldn't win (I missed anyway).

The game is hard, un-documented, un-userfriendly, and not worth the asking price.

Nessy (FGB): Poor graphics and hardly any sound, you must control a snake to eat a rat and man, very boring.

Hellion (Orpheus): Brilliant loading screen and good gameplay. You must battle through 101 levels of insane blasting, quite good sound too. Bombyx (Dialog): A much better version of 'Nessy' and 'Snake It'. You must move a growing worm around the screen eating fruit and avoiding walls.
